Bible Reading - Colossians 1:15-23

15 The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. 16 For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. 17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. 18 And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. 19 For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, 20 and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.

21 Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of[g] your evil behaviour. **22** But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation— **23** if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant.

Sermon – The Glory of Christ (Colossians 1:15-23) The Glory of Christ (Colossians 1:15-23)

Who is Jesus? Islam says he is just another prophet. Some Jewish thinkers claim Jesus as a Jewish teacher. There are Marxist readings of Jesus. There is the New Age version of Jesus. There was even one fellow in the 1960s who proposed Jesus was actually a hallucinogenic mushroom! Who is Jesus?

Colossians 3:16 tells us that these early Christian were singing "psalms, hymns and spiritual songs" to each other in their meetings. Pliny the Roman Governor of Bythinia writing to Emperor Trajan in 112AD describes Christians in Bythinia as a bunch of people who were in the habit of "Singing hymns to Christ as God."

That's what this passage is in Colossians 1:15-20, a gospel hymn. A hymn of praise to Christ as God.

Where does Jesus fit into the cosmos? Often we begin with, "where do fit into the cosmos. And the paradoxical answers come back: you are a speck of dust and the very centre of the universe. Which one? We need to first understand where Christ fits into the cosmos. And then we can get our place.

Jesus...

- 1. The Lord of Creation
- 2. The Lord of the new creation

1. The Lord of Creation

Look at verse 15 again, "He is the image of the invisible God."

Do you want to know what God looks like? Jesus. The Bible says God is unknown. He's invisible apart from Jesus. Jesus is how we know God. He's the image. God is unknowable, unreachable, alien to us, unless Jesus reveals Him.

The Greek word for image is 'Icon' An icon is the face of something. The representation of that thing. The face of rocknroll is Elvis. The face of tennis is Federer. The face of fashion is Coco Channel.

The face of God is Jesus. If you wanna know what God is like, you look to Jesus. And that's good news isn't it! Someone said, "If God isn't like Jesus, he ought to be..." Everyone loves Jesus. Look at his life. Look at how he was born into poverty. Look at how he loved people. He healed them. Look at how he treated the marginalised and the oppressed. Look how patient he was with sinners. Look at how he washed His disciples feet. Look at how he stretched out his arms to the world. Look at how he bled and died for you. Do you know what you're look at.....

The very image of God. In Jesus you see the true God. Jesus is God with skin on his face. We see the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. That's why Jesus Himself said, "If you've seen me you've seen the Father.."

He is the image of the invisible God, and the firstborn over all creation. Next time the JWs come knocking on your door. Don't pretend you're home. Invite them in and tell them this: The firstborn in the Bible is the heir. Solomon is described as David's firstborn, but he was not David's first son to be born. And that's what Paul means here, "He is the heir over all creation." It belongs to him. It's all coming to him.

Far from being created, Christ is the Creator. Check out verses 16-17: For by Him all things were created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities, all things have been created by Him and for him. And he is before all things, and by him all things hold together."

Christ is God. He is the agent of creation - by him. And it was made for him. And he sustains it. That's almost unbelievable! My mind can't take it in.

Next time you go down to Dudley beach on warm sunny day you should think of Colossians 1:16. God the Father said, I want a beach. The second person of the Trinity creates it. The second person of the Trinity sustains it. What the point of Dudley beach? The point of Dudley beach is for Christ and for his sake it was made. It's for his glory. Now we're beginning to think straight about Jesus Christ.

Now let's carry that through. This means my bodily life is in His hands. Who made me? Christ. What am I made for? Christ. What sustains my life? Christ. This means I owe Christ not just my spiritual life. I owe him my physical existence. My physical body belongs to Him. And this means he sustains my body, until he does't wish to sustain me.

This means, Christ is concerned with your physical life just as much as your spiritual. There is no sacred secular divide. Your family belong to him. Your finances belong to him. You health belongs to him. You need to go away for a while and meditate on that. You can't just take Sunday and say, "Lord Jesus' that's yours." Because he says, "sorry pal, but I made it all. There's not a square inch that Christ doesn't cry, "Mine!" Over. Now we're beginning to have a bigger Christ than most people ever dreamed of. He is Lord of creation.

And He is....

2. The Lord of the New Creation

Look at verse 18, "And he is also the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the first born from the dead, so that in all things he might have the preeminence." He is the Lord of creation. And the Lord of the new creation: the church, which is His body. If I was ruler of the cosmos, the last thing I'd want to be head over is the church! It's a bit embarrassing to be associated with isn't it? It's full of weirdos. Weak people, broken and sinful people. But Jesus isn't ashamed to us brothers. Instead he's chosen to unite himself to His people in the most intimate way.

He's starting something new. This world is beautiful, but it's broken. And it's because of sin. Which brought death and decay.

But in Jesus Christ we see the Creator stepping into His creation. And renewing it and restoring it. Someone said, "Everywhere he went Eden was restored" And he died and rose again. He is the firstborn from the dead. In Him we see the beginning of the new creation. A new world. Death will be no more!

.... "So that he might come to have first place in everything." He is first, so he must have first place. Let's make sure we give him first place, in our church. In our prayers. In our hymns. In our sermons. In all our meetings and plannings. And Bible studies. Give him first place. It would be wrong not to. "For God was pleased to have all his fulness dwell in him..." God has put everything we need in one place. It pleased God to have all his fulness in Him. Let's make sure we're constantly drawing from His fulness. Living out of it. Holding on to the head, being nourished and built up. That's the only silver bullet to church growth. A church without Christ at the centre is like a headless chook. It might run around frantically for a while. Busy with activity. But eventually it will drop dead.

If he has the power to sustain the universe, than he has power to sustain our little church doesn't he?

And let's look again at **what our Lord Jesus did on that cross:** Check out verse 20: "And through Him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of His cross."

When you have little kids you got to tidy up after them. Toys are everywhere, draws are open, food all over the place. It's chaos. What a relief when chaos is defeated and everything is put back where it

belongs! That's what Jesus did for us on the cross. He is putting everything back in it's right place. He's bringing about the new creation. And he has done it by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Think of it. The one who made heaven and earth, now suspended between heaven and earth on a cross. That face, which is the icon, the image of the invisible God, the brightness of God's glory, caked in blood and sweat and tears. **Why?** To put the cosmos back together. Sin has ripped everything out of joint.

The Bible says this is what is wrong with our world. This is why there's wars, and abuse, and heartache. We've tried everything else but it hasn't worked. Politics hasn't done it. Technology hasn't done it. All this talk of equality hasn't done it. It's like trying to put a band aid on a dislocated shoulder. The cause is our broken relationship with God.

We are separated from our Maker. And it's our fault. Notice in verse 21, "Once you were alienated and hostile in your minds expressed in your evil actions. We initiated the divorce. We (humanity) wanted to go our own way. When Jesus hung between earth and heaven on the cross, he made peace. He came to make peace, not war. He's putting everything back together where it belongs: including you and me! Notice in verse 22, "But now he has reconciled you by his physical death, to present you holy, faultless, and blameless before him."

The one who has eternal and infinite significance, has reached down to us who are finite and insignificant. And he lifts us up to the highest heights with himself. In Jesus Christ we see a God who loves you more than his own life. A God who'd rather die than live without you. In Jesus Christ our Creator has reached out to bring us back to Himself. He endured a brutal death so that you can be made beautiful: holy and blameless

So if you're connected to Jesus, there's nothing you to need to do to get you to God. I'm already reconciled. It doesn't depend on my performance. Some days I feel more holy and blameless. Some days I feel pretty unholy and sinful. But when I'm in Christ, my relationship with God is fixed and final, "Holy without blemish, and free from accusation!" That's how God pictures me in Christ? Is that how you see yourself?

But there's one more thing we need to look at: Look at verse 23, "If indeed you remain grounded steadfast in the faith, and are not shifted away from the hope of the gospel that you heard." What does that mean? It means you go on believing this gospel you have heard, which has been preached to you. It means returning to verse 22 again and again. Everyday you can say, "I don't care about what my feelings tell me. God's word says, I'm holy, without blemish and free from accusation." It doesn't depend on my performance. But on Jesus finished work.

Do you understand that? Maybe you're here, and you're starting to see that God is completely Jesus-shaped. And you're starting to see that Jesus is completely God-sized. And you're being drawn to him. Well tonight you can go from someone 'alienated from God' to someone 'reconciled to God.' Simply by turning to Jesus. If you're feeling insignificant and lost in this world. Come to Jesus Christ to find who is the meaning of life.

Once - alienated, enemies, evil.

But now holy in God's sight, without blemish, free from accusation.

IF you keep believing this gospel - keep clinging to Jesus. Insignificant. "You" - the Lord of all is concerned with YOU. He'd rather die than live without you.

So I'm just going to lead us in a little prayer where you can respond to Jesus.

It'll just say "Jesus, I recognize that YOU are Lord. I'm sorry for living for myself. Thank you for making peace on the cross. Forgive me and lead me from now on. Amen."
