Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. 3 He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, 4 having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

# Sermon

Having Christmas Eve the day before we celebrate Christmas seems to overshadow our normal service. This is why we deliberately have done something different today so as not to distract too much from tomorrow's celebration.

Many of the traditions and images that we associate with Christmas come from the northern hemisphere where they are heading into the middle of winter. I thought that we should spend some time today reflecting on the nature of Christmas here in Australia.

We are not subject to massive snow storms or the freezing weather that triggers the images of sleigh bells and keeping warm with roaring fires in the fire place. Instead we can be faced with cyclones up north and bush fires just about everywhere else.

Rather than concentrate on the negative I would rather look at the massive collection of gifts that are freely distributed to those in need here in our lucky country. Having for many years been a person who distributed gifts from the Target Giving Tree it was wonderful to hear of the joy which those gifts gave to people who had no other way of celebrating Christmas. I can remember the people from places which supported families with younger children becoming almost as excited as the children would be on Christmas Day as they selected the gifts for their clients.

Unlike our friends up in the northern hemisphere we are also able to look forward to summer holidays and times for the family to gather and catch up after a busy year. It is not that long ago that even this was curtailed by Covid but we have long since resumed our family celebrations.

Many organisations also put on free Christmas meals for those without families and those in need. I think that the biggest one around here is at the sheds on the foreshore of the harbour.

Looking back at the ideas celebrated in our advent candles we have had: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. These are the fruits of that momentous birth in Bethlehem so many years ago.

After our Christmas celebrations tomorrow we will quickly be looking forward to our New Year's celebrations. We can only look in wonder and hope for the new year. As a congregation we are still hoping that the civil works will be substantially completed by the end of the holidays.

On January 26 we will not only have an Australia Day holiday but also applications will close for our proposed Community Engagement person. We are fortunate to have the opportunity to be able to reach out to people in our local area and be able to develop new connections and learn new ways to be the Uniting Church in this magnificent part of Australia. As we look to the wonder of the message coming out of the Christmas story tomorrow we are equally being drawn into a new year with new possibilities here in this wide brown land of fires and flooding rains.
