Bible Reading – Ephesians 2:1-10 (NIV)

"As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, ² in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. ³ All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. ⁴ But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, ⁵ made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. ⁶ And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, ⁷ in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— ⁹ not by works, so that no

one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

Sermon – Godliness is grounded in grace! (Stephen T)

In 1854, Hudson Taylor left England to take the gospel to inland China. Of course, those were the days before the internet or modern banking so letters and funds took months to arrive by ship. And at one point, Hudson's money ran out entirely. For months he had absolutely nothing to live on. What should he do? Ask for help? That would take months for a letter to return home & a reply to be received. Sail back home? But he has no money to buy a ticket! He resolved to trust God to provide and that's exactly what happened.

That experience—living by faith rather than depending on formal pledges—shaped Taylor's conviction that mission should be grounded in total dependence on God's provision. This became the foundation of what we now call the faith mission movement, where missionaries go out without guaranteed salaries, trusting that God will move His people to supply their needs in His timing. Its defining motto, "If God calls, God will supply."

Now just as Hudson Taylor's experience of delay and financial need grounded his conviction that God could be trusted to provide, so we must rely completely on what God's provides for us as we respond to God's grace, God's glory & God's gift to enable us to grow in Godliness. And nowhere is that better expressed than in Titus 2.

Slide 2

The book of Titus is Paul's letter to his ministry apprentice. Paul had brought the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to the people of Crete. Now Crete in our day and even in those days is a beautiful place – clear crystal waters, pink sand beaches, soaring mountains but in Paul's days the Cretans had a really bad reputation. Paul in Titus 1:12, quotes one of their own prophets as saying that Cretans are "always liars, evil beasts and lazy gluttons."

But the grace of God had come to this island and many had become Christians. So, Paul had sent Titus to pastor this new Church. And a bit later he sends him the letter Titus. It will help Titus to help these young believers who are grounded in the God's grace and encourages them to grow in godliness. And the passage we are looking at today, Titus 2:11-14, is maybe its most important section. It is just one sentence & has its main subject being God's grace.

Slide 3

1. Grace (verse 11)

11 "For the **grace of God** has appeared that offers salvation to all people." Paul will ground everything he has to say about godliness in God's grace. For that grace has now appeared in the form of the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It didn't come after mankind conducted a diligent search; no, they weren't looking for God's grace. It came because God wanted to make a part of his character explicit to all people. Not just to the Jews but now even to the Gentiles.

This grace offers all people salvation, even those with a bad reputation like the Cretans. All now have a chance to have their sins forgiven and their relationship with God restored. Sin and defiance had slammed the door on God's offer of living with his people 24/7. That door had then been locked and bolted, so there was no way back. But now due to God's initiative, his kindness in sending Christ to save sinners, all kinds of people, men/women, young/old, slave/free, teacher/student now have access to God's gracious salvation.

Now most will decline that access & keep on living without the Lord as their King & Saviour, but elsewhere Paul will say that the death of Jesus is sufficient for the salvation of the whole world but it is only efficiently applied to those who put their trust in God's saving acts for them.

Slide 4

Now you probably have all heard the definition of GRACE as God's Riches At Christ's Expense. That God's showers his riches and blessing on those who did not in any way deserve it or earn it. For we all deserved His judgment and wrath. But when Jesus takes that punishment on our behalf, we instead get the reward that Jesus perfect life accrued to him. Grace then becomes the foundation of our relationship with God. It is what grounds everything that the Christian life is based on, from then on.

But as I was reading about grace, I also came across this definition of GRACE, which I really like. It encourages us to spell out "GRACE" as...

G (stands) for Gift, the principle of grace.

R (stands) for Redemption, the purpose of grace.

A (stands) for Access, the privilege of grace.

C (stands) for Character, the product of grace.

E (stands) for Eternal Life, the prospect of grace.

Slide 5

Grace isn't just the ignition that fires the Christian life up. It is also the engine that moves the Christian life forward. Grace isn't just what starts the Christian life. Grace also affects our attitude, our appetites, our ambitions and our actions as we live out the Christian life. In the words of John Newtons famous hymn, "Its grace that bought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home."

So, as we start our five-part series on godliness, on living a life that responds to all that God has done for us, we need to realise that our godliness needs to be grounded in God's grace. It can't be divorced from God's grace. "For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions." Grace teaches us about godliness. We don't start with God's gift and end up with our own good works. We start with grace and end with grace. Actually, we start with grace and end with

Slide 6

2. God's Glory (verse 13)

"It (grace) teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness & worldly passions & to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, 13 while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of **the glory** of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ"

Slide 7

Godliness is sandwiched between two appearances of Jesus! The grace of his first appearance & the glory of his second coming. What Paul is saying is that the birth, death of Jesus is an appearing of grace. The coming of Jesus is God's primary act of grace. But there is a second appearing also of Jesus & that is when he will come again. And this appearing will bring with it, God's glory. So, our godliness is sandwiched between those two appearances.

Slide 8

Now can I just point out that the word Paul uses here is not coming but appearing. We use his second coming or his first coming all the time but appearing has a slightly different emphasis. Appearing means that Jesus was already here but now we get to see him, whereas coming means that Jesus is about to arrive at the place where we are situated.

Slide 9

Let's think about it this way, the sun doesn't come to us in the morning, it appears to us. The sun is always there; it is just that the rotation of the earth hides it from us until dawn arrives.

In the same way Jesus is already our great God and Saviour and he is already ruling the world from heaven. It is just that we can't see him. But somewhere in the future we will see him as he is right now, when he appears. Similar Jesus already existed in heaven from the creation of the world but in the past, he appeared as a man and those alive got to see him and the salvation that he is was offering all men.

But when Jesus appears a second time, we will see him in all of his glory, the glory of God Himself. When Jesus appeared the first time he laid aside his majesty and took on human flesh, but God's glory in some way still shone from him. Now there is no filter, no hiding the glory of God. I suppose like Moses in the book of Exodus our eyes could not stand God's glory because of our unholiness. But when God comes again, the Christian will be changed and become like their Saviour Jesus and so will be able to behold his glory.

Friends, that is the believer's future. Not just seeing God's glory, but reflecting God's glory to those around us. No longer under the punishment of sin or even the power of sin, that's our lot at the moment, but one day we won't even have within our being the presence of sin!

Slide 10

That's our future. That's the hope that we can hold onto right now. And hope is not just a nice dream, I hope that one day I can get rid of my dodgy knee and do everything I want to do in the future, including playing soccer again. That's how we often use the word hope. But hope in the Bible is an assured expectation. For example, when you buy a plane ticket, you hold in your hand an expectation that you will get a seat that will take you far away. And what Paul is saying we have in our hands the hope of seeing the glory of God in Jesus Christ.

Slide 11

And that too holds within it the hope that we will share in that Glory. That one-day God will get rid of all ungodliness and worldly passion from our lives. And instead fill us to the brim with self-control, upright and godly lives as we live in this present age. One day we will be perfect. That's the goal of God's grace, its final purpose. So, shouldn't that be my aim as I wait? Shouldn't godliness then be a priority for those who have received God's grace and are looking forward to the appearing of God's glory?

Friends there should be in each one of us the push and pull of God Himself. The push that comes from behind due to the wonder of God's grace, how he has given us this incredible gift of salvation and yet at the very same time we also experience the pull of God's glory as we are carried forward by the hope of joining in God's glory.

Slide 12

Someone once asked John Wesley "If you knew that you were going to die tomorrow, what would you do for the rest of this day?" He said, "Exactly what I had planned to do." The person responded, "How so?" Wesley said, "Well, I am attempting to live my life for God's glory, to do his will in everything, and when he returns, I want him to find me doing his will. So, I'd better get about doing exactly what I had planned to do."

Slide 13

3. So, the response to God's grace & to God's glory needs to be our Godliness (verse 12) 11 "For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. 12 It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, 13 while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ,"

Grace teaches us in the ways of godliness. But it is not just giving us good advice, it puts God's Holy Spirit in our hearts, enabling us to do what we have been told to do, empowering us ever onward. You see grace is not just the starter motor igniting the Christian life, it is the engine that moves the Christian ever onwards and upwards.

So often the ethical teachings of the Bible seem way beyond our pay grade. Love your neighbours, forgive those who have hurt you, offer yourselves as living sacrifices, stop lying and cheating, get rid of any mean talk. Yeah right. I've tried to do those things again & again and I sometimes make a good start but I can never, ever keep it up. Well try harder! I am trying the hardest I can do and I just can't keep doing it!

That's where God's grace comes in. Our hearts are flooded with wonder, thanksgiving, gratitude for all that God has done for me. I am no longer in evils grip, so why on earth would I want to go back there? So, I don't rely on my own resources but look instead to God's grace. It teaches me, trains me to say no to the ungodly passions that are still swirling inside my head and my heart. I now have the full armour of God available to me, when tempted by the evil one. I am not on my own anymore. I am not fighting this battle as a solo soldier any longer. I have the Spirit of God, I have my brothers and sisters in Christ, I have the power that raised Christ back from the dead available to help me, no matter what I face.

So, when I am filled with anger, hatred, ambition, lust, greed, I need to remember they are not the only forces within me. There is also love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness & self-control. That's part of God's gift of grace; & I can look forward to what Jesus will do for me when he appears again, when I will be filled with his goodness and his glory. And that will help me to say no to the bad stuff today and yes to the good stuff.

Slide 15

That grace produces godliness in three dimensions. As many have noticed, self-control, is directed inward, to ourselves, to our own desires, our motivations, our pursuits. And then uprightness is related to the word for justice, and so it relates to our love for our neighbours, that we would treat one another with kindness, integrity, honesty, compassion & generosity. And then a godly life deals with our relationship to God, so that our lives should be marked by worship and devotion and sacrifice. Godliness is then inward, outward and upward

Let's look at them one by one, beginning with what is going on inside of us. Self-control is the work of the Spirit where our hearts are liberated from our former slavery to sinful desires. Grace gives us a new heart and renews our wills to now want to live under Christ's lordship. Self-control then is not self-help, where over time I take control of myself. No, being a fruit of the Spirit, it is about placing ourselves continually under his control.

Slide 16

Imagine a wild stallion, unbroken and impossible to ride. Then the master comes and trains it, bringing its power under control. That's what grace does—it doesn't destroy our desires but brings them under the mastery of Christ. And it also affects our outward actions.

Slide 17

We become upright. Our actions change. The ways of God, the commands of God, the ethical teachings of God begin to rub off on us. The faith that we have in God's grace bears fruit. It changes not just our beliefs but our actions. Picture a tree that was once barren and dead. Then the gardener grafts in a healthy branch. Over time, new green shoots appear, signs that life has truly come. That's what happens within us. Which means upright living and how we teat others is the visible fruit that God's grace is truly at work in us.

Slide 18

Then there is our behaviour towards God Himself. Before we were spiritually dead, now we are spiritually alive. Before we were like a compass, spinning wildly, unable to find north, now we have been repaired and the direction of our lives is pointing northwards, upwards to God Himself. Which means we want to worship the Lord more and more. We love Him with heart, soul, mind and strength. We enjoy being with Him and we know that sin puts a barrier in our way & so our affections change from that of living to satisfy

our own worldly desires to wanting to let the word change us & give us more and more desires for God and his ways.

Slide 19

So, this part of God's word should be asking us today, is what are we currently saying no to? And what are we attempting to say yes to? What items of ungodliness are we attempting to unclothe ourselves with and what purchase of godliness that Jesus has given us are we trying to put on? What are we working on? We can't change everything all at once. So, is it your anger? Your coldness to others? Your lusts? Your greed? Your swearing? Your drinking? Remember God's grace has saved you from that sort of a lifestyle. Put on the armour of God and get out again into the battle.

And then what sort of lifestyle are you currently embracing? A physically healthy one or a spiritually healthy one? A beautiful body or a beauty of character? God has empowered you to no longer come under the power of sin, you can now be under the power of the Spirit. Use him. Attach the plug to the power source. Turn on the switch. Don't try and do this on your own. Remember God's gift.

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4. God's gift (verse 14)

"Our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, 14 who **gave himself** for us to redeem us from all wickedness & to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good."

The work is his. What God requires, he supplies. He not only has given you his grace and will one day reveal to you, his glory. He also wraps your godliness in his good gift of Jesus.

You see the salvation that God gives us in Jesus is twofold. It is a redemption and a purification. Bryan Chappel tells the true story of heavy rains drenching a part of Southern California. While a family were asleep a mudslide slammed into their house, ripping apart of half of it and taking with it their sleeping baby. As you can imagine the parents were frantically searching from then on for their little child. Crying out for him to respond.

Slide 21

But nothing. But in the morning a rescuer came to them with a mud caked bundle in his hands. Their baby, filthy but alive. You can imagine the scene, they held him close, it didn't matter how muddy he was. This baby was alive!

But of course, later, they washed him for it is not enough that he was saved, he needed cleaning. For being covered in mud was not the best thing for their son. The way forward was to cleanse the baby and to try and keep the baby clean from now on. And that's what this passage is telling us is how God treats us. He gives us the gift of salvation, redeeming us from all wickedness. And over time he takes us out of the mud and muck of sin to purify us & enable us to live for him. He frees us from the punishment of sin; he releases us from the power of sin and over time he encourages us to live away from the presence of sin.

Slide 22

To live a life of godliness. Because we are now not our own but a people who are Gods very own. How special is that! And that should make us eager, willing, desiring to do what is good. But not in our own strength but in reliance on God's grace and looking forward to the appearing of God's glory, we make the most of God's gift of his son Jesus and His Holy Spirit to live lives that will bring honour and glory and praise to the one who has rescued us from the avalanche of sin and mud, and cleansed us and given us a new chance to live for him.

That's why Paul wants to teach Titus and the Cretans and ourselves these things. That's why the leaders of every congregation should encourage their people and rebuke them with all authority. Because godliness comes to each of us when we are grounded in God's grace.

The Puritans would say these things will only happen due to the power of new affections. We will not grow holy due to guilt, or sheer willpower or even good preaching, it only comes when our affections are overtaken by God's grace, our thoughts are filled with a desire for God's glory and our hearts are overwhelmed in thankfulness for God's good gift of Jesus.

Slide 23

The Puritans would regularly place before their people the picture of the live oak, a variety of trees whose leaves, although dead, would stick to the branches throughout winter. Those dead leaves would stay until spring when the new life coming up from the trunk would force out the dead leaves and replace them with the leaves and fruit ready for the new season of life. That's what you and I need. The power of God inside us, filling us with his grace, point us toward his glory and giving us the drive to live lives of godliness for him and him alone.

Slide 24

That's what Titus 2:11–14 is teaching us today. God's plan is that His grace saves us, His Spirit transforms us in godliness, His promise gives us hope in glory, and His Son's sacrifice is the greatest gift of all. May this grace shape our hearts, our lives, and our longing for the day when we see our Saviour face to face.
