SERMON

How many of you have ever tried to train a dog?

I was thinking about this the other day and from listening to Jan's stories Jan and Sasha are constantly training one another, even today.

Luckily my dog, Phoebe, is at the stage now where she is very placid, unless there is a chance that she can go out with us. Then she starts to skip around and dance. Ever see a greyhound dance?

One of the most difficult things I have had to do is to try to train a dog to do something that is contrary to it nature. It does not take long when you have a few treats and want them to sit, then stay and so on. When it comes to a bowl of food it is far harder for a dog just to sit there and wait for the command because eating their food immediately is a basic instinct. I was lucky that Phoebe learned very quickly that she would still get the meal if she waited for my command.

There are lots of instincts for both animals and humans. Perhaps the most basic is the 'fight or flight' reflex. I am sure that we can all relate to this. When any animal, or a human is faced with a dangerous situation there is an automatic flush of adrenaline and the next decision can be almost automatic. The result is that either you stay and fight or take advantage of any possible escape route. Normally the preferred option is to escape but when this is blocked off then, like when you are cornered, there can only be a fight response.

As Jesus is heading towards Jerusalem and inevitable suffering at the hands of the authorities His disciples were urging Him to take the flight option. Avoiding any confrontation was preferable to tangling with the many powerful groups in Jerusalem, including the Romans who were wanting to keep the city quiet at all costs.

Peter, as the leader of this group, expresses their natural reaction to the 'fight or flight' options facing the group. They recognised that that it will be dangerous to return to Jerusalem and the group was obviously fearful of what faced them. They were not in any position to fight the powerful people who ran Jerusalem and the Temple. It was a natural instinct to look at alternatives, like not going back!

Jesus responds with His typical directness when faced with the lack of support by His followers: "Get behind me, you Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

Jesus seems to admit that this journey could be a 'stumbling block', even for the Son of God. The Greek word here for 'stumbling block' is the same word that they also used for 'scandalise.' It would have been in many ways been simple common sense that alternative ideas be explored.

However Jesus is putting forward no alternative. He going to keep His focus travelling to Jerusalem and facing up to any consequences. He was prepared for whatever happens. Jesus continues to tell His followers that they need to be able to resist their normal survival instincts as there is no other way forward. "Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."

If we look at Paul's letter to the Romans we find an echo of the determination that Jesus is showing. In our reading today Paul says: "Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ... Do not repay anyone evil for evil ... Never avenge yourselves ... If your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink ... Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."

As we can see both Jesus and Paul are leading us in the same direction. We are called to resist our basic instinct to run away and avoid conflict which is our most basic survival instinct. Pushing beyond our 'flight reflex' we are guided to be open to the path that Jesus opens up for us, that is 'The Way of the Cross.'

Jesus chose not to flee but to face up to the violent hostility with His body. Jesus didn't lay down and allow injustice and violence to go ahead unchallenged, this is a common misconception.

Fleeing would have allowed the injustice to continue unchallenged. His non-violence stance unmasked any supposed legitimacy that there may have previously been of those evil ways and exposed it for everyone to see.

Had Jesus bowed down to those in power they could have kept on with the illusion that their position legitimised violence in the name of their laws and their own self-interest. By standing up to them in a non-violent response Jesus not only exposes their aggression for what it is, but also starts to neutralise it by absorbing their assault. If Jesus had not done that the blood lust of the mob would have sought out other victims perhaps even us. Consequently he stopped that deadly spiral into chaos.

In our faith we hear the call to resist those trying to legitimise greed, selfishness, infidelity, violence and exploitation. It is precisely this approach which can provoke a backlash from those who have no regard for humanity. We are all called to be ambassadors for the One who 'Walked the Way of the Cross.'

This is not some simplistic objective but it is a call to be counter-intuitive like trying to get a dog to resist the urge to jump in and eat a bowl of meat.

It is the Holy Spirit which helps us to learn to go against those basic instincts and scandals that go against justice and decency. We need to be able to trust that God will support us when we feel unable to continue. While some may think that the 'Way of the Cross' leads only to death we need to recognise that Jesus saw beyond this and said: "Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. What will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? Or what will they give in return for their life?"

Peter heard Jesus speak only of the suffering and death that awaited him in Jerusalem, but Jesus didn't only say that. Peter didn't fully comprehend all that Jesus said. Jesus had also said that he would be raised to life on the third day.

Jesus saw through the reflex to fight or flee and beyond that to the way that leads not only to the cross, but through the salvation of the cross to the new life in the wide-open spaces of God's love and grace.

I know that I can train a dog to refuse a bowl of raw meat more easily than I can myself be trained to turn the other cheek to hostility and violence, but it is only the "Way of the Cross" that leads to life. Let us hear the call and together allow the Holy Spirit to train us, despite our instincts, in the ways of life.
